8.1	Tavistock Customer Service Excellence Awards – These have been really well received and many nominations entered already – need to keep up the momentum with press and social media coverage – Rhiannon working on sponsorship/prizes – Bedford Hotel – Two Bridges – Moorland Garden.	JS
8.2	Record Breaking Cream Tea – No update due to lack of response from GWR – perhaps June next year?	
8.3	<b>Eco-Fest</b> – A number of shops have signed up to advertising their sustainable products/activities after a walkabout - brochure to be done	JS/Ursula Mann
8.4	Lions Club/Carnival – As with Eco-Fest, after a slow response JS/JM have managed to get a number of businesses involved in the Carnival Day Festival – more canvassing needed – JM will do this – Ben HQ doing a flyer	JM
9	PARKING – Coaches – JS asked for any feedback from Directors regarding the parking questionnaire – will be discussed further – it was noted that there had been an increase in the number of coaches coming to Tavistock.	
10	Manager update – JS had been busy particularly with FiverFest – media coverage excellent and feedback from businesses very positive – another national campaign planned for October.  JS had met with Wayne Southall and Matt Voller (Plastic Free Tavistock and Surfers Against Sewage).  KH and JS encouraging meeting in Falmouth with Richard Wilcox, BID Manager – Falmouth BID has good working partnership with their Town Council – JS hopes to replicate this and investigate regular meeting with Traders – wanted to check how Falmouth BID Manager approaches sponsorship opportunities – he has regular partners for almost every event that the town puts on – discuss:- 5 priority projects for a sponsorship campaign – new signposts – Tavistock gift card – Town Guide – additional Christmas lights – new annual event/festival. He encouraged weekly email and more like bi-monthly newsletter - VD suggested BID links with historical events – May next year opening of Guildhall?  JS also attended meeting of SW BID's – looking to share information so that Brittany Ferries can formulate a peninsula marketing approach which will drive traffic into the region in general – we have been asked to contribute £150 a year to be part of this group covering the time of Lucy Ball (decision marketing consultant) plus any costs incurred with regional lobbying.  JS also met with Denise Gatley of the Library regarding future collaborations and she was very keen to support our events. She is also very happy to provide free space for any events we would like to hold there.  JS meeting with Julian Greaves regarding lights – need to sort lights that BID borrowed from TTC and used in West Street last year as they were not in use.
